

# Ad Clerum 3.0 // Instructions

## How To: Right Sidebar Posting

Ad Clerum 3.0 allows you to post in three different sections of the theme. The main center section and two sections in the right sidebar. This is achieved by using the DomTab script by [onlinetools.org](#). To configure your theme to take advantage of this posting system, please follow the step-by-step instructions below:

1. Login to your Wordpress Administration Panel create following categories: Community Events and Latest Audio.

To do this: While in your Administration Panel > Manage > Categories > Click 'Add New' and fill out the following: Category Name: Community Events, Category Slug: community-events, you can leave the rest blank. Click the 'Add Category' button to save. Repeat these instructions for the 'Latest Audio' category.

2. Once you create your new categories, notice your category ID number. For those using WordPress 2.5, you will need to hover over the created category and notice the URL displayed in your status bar of your browser. The ID should be listed and the end of the URL.
3. Open your index.php file using an HTML editor. I always recommend [NotePad2](#). Look for the following on lines 8 and 9:

```
<?php if (in_category('15')) continue; ?>  
<?php if (in_category('6')) continue; ?>
```

Change the numbers 15, and 6 to the category ID's you have just created. Remember to save your changes.

4. Next time you post, make sure you check either the Community Events or Latest Audio category in order for posts to show up in the right sidebar. If you want to rename the

default categories, you can do so by editing your right.php file. Just be careful to **only** change the names and nothing else. Example:

Old Script:

```
<?php $my_query = new WP_Query('category_name=Community
Events&showposts=4');
while ($my_query->have_posts()) : $my_query->the_post();
$do_not_duplicate = $post->ID; ?>
```

New Script:

```
<?php $my_query = new WP_Query('category_name=News&showposts=4');
while ($my_query->have_posts()) : $my_query->the_post();
$do_not_duplicate = $post->ID; ?>
```

## How To: Right Sidebar Alternative

If you have no need for right sidebar posting, edit all of your Ad Clerum php files except the following: comments.php, comments-popup.php, functions.php, header.php, left.php, right.php, right-alternative.php, searchform.php.

Find the following line:

```
<?php include(TEMPLATEPATH."/right.php");?>
```

Change to:

```
<?php include(TEMPLATEPATH."/right-alternative.php");?>
```

## How To: Changing Menu Position

If you would like to have the menu below the pictures, open the header.php file and swap the following:

```
<div id="menuholder">
  <div id="nav">
    <ul>
      <li><a href="<?php echo get_settings('home'); ?>">Home</a></li>
      <?php wp_list_pages('title_li='); ?>
    </ul>
  </div>
```

```
<?php include (TEMPLATEPATH . '/searchform.php'); ?>
</div>
```

```
<div id="pics">
    <div id="left-pic"></div>
    <div id="middle-pic"></div>
    <div id="right-pic"></div>
</div>
```

Example:

```
<div id="pics">
    <div id="left-pic"></div>
    <div id="middle-pic"></div>
    <div id="right-pic"></div>
</div>
```

```
<div id="menuholder">
    <div id="nav">
        <ul>
            <li><a href="<?php echo get_settings('home'); ?>">Home</a></li>
            <?php wp_list_pages('title_li='); ?>
        </ul>
    </div>
</div>
```

```
<?php include (TEMPLATEPATH . '/searchform.php'); ?>
</div>
```

## How To: Remove Search Form within Menu

Old Code:

```
<div id="menuholder">
    <div id="nav">
        <ul>
            <li><a href="<?php echo get_settings('home'); ?>">Home</a></li>
            <?php wp_list_pages('title_li='); ?>
        </ul>
    </div>
</div>
```

```
<?php include (TEMPLATEPATH . '/searchform.php'); ?>
</div>
```

New Code:

```
<div id="menuholder">
  <div id="nav">
    <ul>
      <li><a href="<?php echo get_settings('home'); ?>">Home</a></li>
      <?php wp_list_pages('title_li='); ?>
    </ul>
  </div>
</div>
```

In your stylesheet, find the following:

```
#nav {
  width: 60%;
  background: #38424E;
  float: left;
}
```

Change to:

```
#nav {
  width: 100%;
  background: #38424E;
  float: left;
}
```

Notice the new width is 100%.
